GENERAL INFORMATION ON THE DISTRICT AND THE AREA

LOCATION – Cerro Gordo is located in central Illinois, 15 miles east of Decatur, 40 miles southwest of Champaign, 50 miles southeast of Bloomington and 55 miles east of Springfield.

TYPE — PreK-12 Unit District; 470 Students.

CURRICULUM — All curriculum is aligned with the common core standards. The district provides a comprehensive curriculum in grades PreK through twelfth grade. The PreK-5 elementary school is structured in a self-contained classroom format with two sections at each grade level. The elementary school has a targeted assistance Title I program with support from both reading and math specialists. Elementary students participate in art, music and physical education (grades K-5), technology instruction (grades 3-5) and band (grade 5).

Grades 1-12 are 1:1 using Chromebooks. The Jr/Sr High is a 6-12 building that utilizes an eight-period schedule of forty-five minute each. In addition to the required curriculum subjects, students have elective opportunities in Agriculture, Family and Consumer Science, Fine Arts and Industrial Technology. CGHS has a strong partnership with Richland Community College. Students in grades 11-12 are afforded a wide variety of career and technical courses and certifications through the Heartland Technical Academy, housed at RCC. Each year, CGHS has multiple graduating seniors also earn their associates degree via dual credits earned both at CGHS and at the Richland Transfer Academy.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS — Special Education programs are offered through the Macon-Piatt Special Education Cooperative. Athletic opportunities include a cooperative sports agreement with the Bement School District. Extracurricular programs include: baseball, basketball, cheerleading, cross country, football, scholastic bowl, softball, track and field, volleyball and bass fishing.

FACILITIES — Cerro Gordo Elementary School was built in 2003 and connected to a primary building that was built in 1955. CGES houses pre-kindergarten through 5th grade.

Cerro Gordo Jr/Sr High School houses 6th through 12th grades and includes the original 1929 building, with additions in 1957, 1962, 2000 and 2019. The Jr/Sr High School campus also has an Agriculture building built in 1953 with a 1962 Industrial Arts addition.

TRANSPORTATION — Contracted with Birch Bus Service.

FOOD SERVICES — Cerro Gordo CUSD 100 runs its own National School Lunch and Breakfast program.
